

Academic Credit from CMU

*for Wilderness First Responder certification
through Wilderness Medical Associates*



Wilderness First Responder (WFR) certification is the ideal medical training for outdoor educators, guides, Search And Rescue team members, and others who work or play in remote areas. The curriculum is comprehensive and practical, including the essential principles and skills required to assess and manage medical problems in isolated and extreme environments. Now you can earn undergraduate or graduate credit after earning your WFR certification.

Earn undergraduate or graduate level credit through CMU

Central Michigan University Off-Campus Programs and Wilderness Medical Associates (WMA) are partnering to offer a credit option to students who successfully complete WFR training and wish to pursue university credit.

Undergraduate Credit

RPL 400AA Issues in Wilderness & Remote Medicine,

3 semester hours

Tuition is \$975 plus a one-time non-degree admission fee of \$50 for anyone not previously admitted to CMU.

Graduate Credit

RPL 600AC Issues in Wilderness & Remote Medicine,

3 semester hours

Tuition is \$1,017, plus a one-time non-degree admission fee of \$50 for anyone not previously admitted to CMU.

Depending on your state's requirements, you may be able to use the CMU credit to meet educator certificate renewal or state continuing education requirements. Since acceptance of credit varies by state, educators should contact their state's licensure body to verify the course will count toward licensure/certification before enrolling for credit. If you wish to apply the credit toward a degree, consult with your academic advisor to verify the course will apply to your program.

Special Course Requirements Prior to CMU Admission and Registration

Prior to applying for either of these courses, you must receive verification from CMU's instructor, and supply proof of completion of the Wilderness First Responder course offered through Wilderness Medical Associates. If you have not completed the WFR course, you may register at www.wildmed.com.

How to Apply for Credit
