Wilderness First Responder to Emergency Medical Responder Transition Modules

The University of California Fresno Parkmedic Program provides a free on-line program that, once completed, allows WFRs from WMA, NOLS, and SOLO to sit for the US National Registry Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) exam. This “dual certification” is becoming increasingly necessary for state and national parks employees, wildland firefighters, and some other users. In the event you need to pursue this dual certification, we have placed these links here for your convenience. We recommend only pursuing this if directed to do so by an employer.

Step 1: Make sure you have a PDF copy of your valid (not expired) WMA WFR Certification card.

Step 2: Go to <https://fresno.ucsf.edu/parkmedic-program/resources#Training-Modules>, open the third menu down on the left labeled Training Modules, and scroll to the bottom of that section until you find the Wilderness First Responder to Emergency Medical Responder Transition Modules and click on the “training Modules” link below the header.

Overview

This transition training course was commissioned by the NPS to provide qualified WFR's a path to advance their EMS knowledge and to obtain certification at the National Registry of EMT's (NREMT) EMR level. Candidates who successfully complete this course and pass the NREMT examinations, will obtain certification as an NREMT EMR, an EMS provider level recognized by the NPS.

This course was created by reviewing WFR curricula currently offered by various organizations and then comparing these curricula to the NREMT EMR Scope of Practice. Educational modules were developed to complete the knowledge base and skills needed to advance the WFR level of training to the EMR level. This course is not intended as a complete EMR course, the expectation for candidates is a full understanding of their WFR knowledge base.
